<p>It is our intention that children will leave Lunsford Primary School being equipped to with the knowledge, understanding and emotions to be able to play an active part in our diverse society. We want our children to be kind, respectful, positive, responsible, hardworking and to persevere in all they do.</p> <p>Our PSHE curriculum develops learning and results in the acquisition of knowledge and skills which will enable children to access the wider curriculum and prepare them to be a global citizen now and in their future roles within a global community. It promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils, preparing them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences for later life.</p> <p>Our Relationships and Sex Education enables our children to learn how to be safe, and to understand and develop healthy relationships, both now and in their future lives.</p>	<p>Pupils are taught PSHE using 'Jigsaw' which is a spiral, progressive scheme of work, covering all of the above and 'aims to prepare children for life, helping them to know and value who they are and understand how they relate to other people in this ever-changing world'. There is a strong emphasis on emotional Literacy, building resilience and nurturing mental and physical health. It includes mindfulness to allow children to advance their emotional awareness, concentration and focus.</p> <p>At Lunsford, RSE is taught through PSHE and our science curriculum. The Sex Education aspects of PSHE are also taught through 'Jigsaw'.</p> <p>It also identifies links to British Values, and SMSC and is taught in such a way as to reflect the overall aims, values, and ethos of the school.</p> <p>Outside visitors such as Relax Kids, Restart a Heart, Money Awareness and Bikeability (among others complement and enrich our PSHE (including British Values and SMSC) curriculum to offer additional learning.</p> <p>Assemblies are linked to PSHE, British Values and SMSC and cover any additional sessions that would benefit the whole school.</p>	<p>By the time our children leave Lunsford they will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• understand and value how they contribute positively to the world.• have positive self-esteem and respect the differences of others.• be able to develop positive, healthy relationship with their peers both now and in the future.• understand the physical aspects involved in RSE at an age appropriate level• recognise and apply the British Values of Democracy, Tolerance, Mutual respect, Rule of law and Liberty.
